Safety Procedures

- Redfish Marine Construction, LLC agrees to comply with all sections of 29 CFR 1926 OSHA Safety and Health Standards for the Construction Industry, all applicable referenced standards recognized by OSHA to include all sections that pertain to employee training and the Contractor's/Owner's Safety Manual. In addition, Redfish Marine Construction, LLC shall comply with all Contractor's/Owner's safety and health and environmental requirements.
- Redfish Marine Construction, LLC shall take full responsibility for the enforcement of OSHA standards for all personnel working under their portion of the contract.
- Redfish Marine Construction, LLC shall provide adequate first aid supplies for his personnel and have a person trained in CPR/First Aid on site at all times when his personnel are performing work.
- Redfish Marine Construction, LLC shall fully comply with all work permit requirements including hot work, confined space, line breaking, excavation, control of hazardous energy, critical lift, etc. required by Contractor/Owner.
- Redfish Marine Construction, LLC agrees to support the Contractor /Owner's injury management program. Redfish Marine Construction, LLC employees shall report all injuries to Contractor/owner superintendent immediately. Each subcontractor shall investigate all incidents including near misses and provide documentation to Contractor's/Owner's superintendent immediately. Redfish Marine Construction, LLC shall investigate all incidents including near misses and provide documentation to Contractor/Owner. A copy of the Redfish Marine Construction, LLC's accident report will be provided to Contractor /Owner's superintendent within 24 hours. Redfish Marine Construction, LLC shall participate fully and provide personnel as requested for incident investigation meetings conducted by Contractor/Owner to determine root causes and corrective actions.
- Redfish Marine Construction, LLC shall promptly correct any condition or work practice identified as potentially hazardous and in violation of OSHA standards. Redfish Marine Construction, LLC's employees unable to correct unsafe conditions shall immediately report these conditions to the Contractor / Owners's superintendent.
- When Redfish Marine Construction, LLC's workforce exceeds 40 or more workers; Redfish Marine Construction, LLC shall employ a full-time safety coordinator approved by Contractor/Owner as competent to perform safety responsibilities for the scope of work to be performed.
- Redfish Marine Construction, LLC shall provide in writing, the names of all competent persons for every section of 29 CFR 1926 that applies to his work. There can be more than one competent person listed for each section of 29 CFR 1926, and at least one competent person shall be on-site at all times while work that is governed by section 29 CFR 1926 is taking place. Should the competent person not be on-site, the work will not be permitted to continue and any delays due to this requirement shall be made up at Redfish Marine Construction, LLC expense.
- Redfish Marine Construction, LLC shall provide a copy of their Hazard Communication Program (CFR 1926.58) and current (no older than 5 years) legible copies of material safety data sheets for each chemical being brought to the project, Redfish Marine Construction, LLC shall notify Contractor/Owner immediately of any chemical or oil spill, no matter how small. Subcontractors will not place containers of chemicals into the project trash dumpster and shall be responsible for all costs involved with the clean-up and proper disposal of spills they cause.
- Redfish Marine Construction, LLC shall conduct pre-task safety planning for each activity. Redfish Marine Construction, LLC shall complete a Job Safety Analysis (JSA) for each scope of work and for each non-routine task. Copies of all completed JSAs shall be made available to Contractor/Owner.
- All workers, delivery personnel and visitors shall wear hard hats, construction type boots or shoes, long trousers and shirts that cover the shoulder and body torso, at all times when on the construction project. Tank tops cut-off t-shirts are not allowed. Shirts must have at least a four-inch sleeve and shirt tails must be tucked into the trousers unless welding. Trousers must be full length and never tucked into boots. Loose fitting clothing, jewelry (rings, watches, bracelets, chains, earrings, etc.) shall not be worn around moving equipment, machinery grinding operations, welding, etc. this applies from day one until certificate of occupancy is received.
- As required by 29 CFR 1926.28, Redfish Marine Construction, LLC shall enforce the wearing of personal protective equipment (i.e., hard hats, clothing footwear, eye protection, etc.) when said equipment is required. Hard hats will be worn with the bill forward (except for welders wearing hoods). Caps shall not be worn under hardhats.)
- Redfish Marine Construction, LLC shall assure 100% eye protection (ANSIZ-87.1) in all work areas. Safety glasses must have rigid side shields. Safety glasses are not required in administrative work areas. Goggles and/or face shields shall be provided and worn by employees performing tasks requiring additional eye protection.
- Hard soled heavy leather shoes or boots (tennis shoes are not permitted) are required to be worn while on all Contractor/Owner projects. Such footwear is not required in administrative areas
- Redfish Marine Construction, LLC shall provide additional Personal Protection Equipment (PPE) as required by task or exposures, including but not limited to work gloves, hearing protection, face shields, respirators, etc. to all employees and assure their use.
- Redfish Marine Construction, LLC shall conduct daily pre-use inspections of all vehicles and mobile equipment, tools, fire extinguishers, single and two-point suspended scaffolds, etc. Inspection records shall be made available upon request to Contractor/Owner.

- Redfish Marine Construction, LLC shall provide, erect, dismantle and remove any and all barricades, railings, covers, and safety netting, fall protection anchorage points and lines that may be required to complete contracted work in compliance with OSHA standards. Redfish Marine Construction, LLC shall provide Contractor's/Owner's superintendent with prior notification before removing any guardrail, cover, and barricade or fall protection device.
- Redfish Marine Construction, LLC's employees shall not bring radios (exempt communication type radios) tape recorders, tape or disc players or video cameras to the job. Authorization to videotape or take photographs must first be approved by Contractor's/Owner's superintendent.
- Redfish Marine Construction, LLC shall conduct weekly toolbox training meetings (29 CFR 1926.21(b) (2) with their employees and provide copies of training attendance sheets to Contractor's/Owner's project superintendent.
- All training required by 29 CFR 1926 or the Contractor's/Owner's Site Safety Manual shall be documented and available for review by the Contractor's/Owner's Safety Director or his designee.
- Contractor/Owner is a Drug- Free workplace. Possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages, drugs, or other noxious behavior on premises is strictly prohibited. Any employee involved in an accident requiring medical attention or any equipment operator involved in an accident shall be required to be tested by an independent testing laboratory and testing results provided to Contractor/Owner.
- Redfish Marine Construction, LLC shall keep work areas, walkways and exits free of clutter and scrap material. Good housekeeping will be part of every work task every day. Break and lunch trash shall be placed in proper trash containers, not on the ground or floor. The separation and disposal of trash shall comply with all applicable local, state and federal standards and Contractor's/Owner's requirements.
- All power tools shall be properly grounded or double insulated. All electrical cords and tools shall be plugged into Ground Fault Circuit Interrupters. Subcontractor shall inspect electrical equipment. Cord sets and tools before each use and conduct documented inspections on a monthly basis. Cords and leads shall be routed overhead to the maximum extent feasible.
- Redfish Marine Construction, LLC shall store materials in a safe and orderly manner that is in compliance with OSHA Subpart H (Material Handling, Storage, Use and Disposal) and project rules.
- Redfish Marine Construction, LLC shall maintain a competent person on the job when disassembling, erecting, moving or repairing a scaffold. The competent person shall be responsible for inspecting all scaffolding before each use and for tagging the scaffold (Tags provided by Contractor/Owner) all users shall be provided awareness level training and to the meaning of each color-coded tag. All scaffolds over six (6) feet shall be equipped with guardrail protection and meet all other requirements of Subpart L (Scaffolds) of the OSHA standards.
- Redfish Marine Construction, LLC shall implement a full hazard training program covering the precautionary actions needed to maximize their safety. Subcontractor must become familiar with the Subpart M (Fall Protection) of the OSHA Standards. Each Subcontractor shall assure 100% fall protection for employees exposed to potential falls of six (6) feet or more as identified in the standard. Dual shock absorbing lanyards shall be provided, if necessary, to employees to maintain 100% fall protection. A copy of the Subcontractor's written fall protection plan, when appropriate, shall be given to the Contractor's/Owner's superintendent prior to work beginning. Any modifications to the written fall protection plan shall be submitted by the Owner of the company for approval by Contractor/Owner prior to implementation.
- Redfish Marine Construction, LLC's employees working out of aerial lifts shall wear a body harness with lanyard tied off to the basket tie-off point at all time, when in the basket.
- Redfish Marine Construction, LLC's employees shall keep a minimum of 19 feet away from any energized power line or further distance as required by Subpart N (Cranes). Crane operators must submit copies of their operator certification prior to operating any cranes on site. Redfish Marine Construction, LLC shall furnish copies of current annual and monthly crane inspection reports to Contractor/Owner for all cranes brought on site to their use. Daily inspection records shall be kept while in operation on the job site.
- Redfish Marine Construction, LLC shall contact the appropriate authorities to identify buried utilities before beginning digging.
- Excavations and trenches over five feet shall be shored sloped or braced in accordance with Subpart P (Excavations) of the OSHA Standards.
- Only properly trained employees in possession of a valid Fork Truck Operator's Permit shall operate fork trucks and rough terrain fork trucks on Contractor/Owner projects, a copy of these permits must be provided to Contractor/Owner Training documentation for lifts shall be provided as well.
- Redfish Marine Construction, LLC employee must have a valid state driver's license to operate any vehicle or mobile equipment on the project. All drivers shall obey posted or designated speed limits. The use of seat belts is mandatory. All mobile equipment and other construction vehicles (not cars or pick-ups with unobstructed rear views) shall have operable back-up alarms. Riding in the rear bed of pickups is not permitted and all passengers in vehicles must be seated in a manufacturer's installed seat.
- Single person All Terrain Vehicles (ATV's) are not permitted on the jobsite. All mules, golf carts and ATVs, must have Roll Over Protection Structures (ROPS) installed on them and a safety flag visible above the vehicle.
- Redfish Marine Construction, LLC shall maintain tools and equipment in a safe condition as required by OSHA standards-Subpart I (Tools=Hand & Power), Subpart J (Welding & Cutting) and all requirements for cutting and welding found in Section 3.5 of the Contractor's EHS Guide Supplement 2, Subpart K (Electrical), Subpart N (Cranes) and Subpart O (Motor Vehicles, Mechanized Equipment, and Marine Operations).
- Redfish Marine Construction, LLC's employees shall inspect their ladders for damage prior to each use and tag damaged ladders out of service. Employees shall be trained in the proper use of ladders as required in Subpart X.
